A4ID's Virtual Law and Development Training Programme

About the online programme

A4ID's flagship law and development training programme provides lawyers with an in-depth understanding of the issues at the heart of the development agenda, and how these relate to their everyday work and their clients' business.

Our 2020 programme covers topics spanning the different Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and explores how the law can be harnessed to reduce poverty, promote equality and protect the environment. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic the last four modules of our 2020 programme had to be postponed. We have

decided to resume our programme from September 2020 as a virtual online training. Each of the modules will now be delivered as two separate half-day afternoon events by our trainers, who are experts in their respective fields.

We have reduced the fees associated with the programme in reflection of the changes to its delivery. We are also opening a low fee scholarship scheme for lawyers who wish to attend our programme, but may otherwise face financial barriers from accessing the course. Further details of this scheme are laid out below.

Why attend this programme?

The private sector is increasingly integrating the SDGs into their business practice in order to better manage their risks, build positions in growth markets, and strengthen their supply chains. As companies seek advice about the legal and regulatory implications of aligning themselves with the goals, the SDGs are fast becoming an emerging area of practice for lawyers to provide responsible advice to corporate clients.

Equally, the SDGs provide an effective framework for law firms to evolve toward a more strategic approach to pro bono work.

Prices and booking

Reduced fee scholarship

We are offering a scholarship for up to seven applicants to attend the remaining four modules (eight sessions in total) of the programme at a highly discounted rate.

The successful applicants will be able to participate in the remaining four modules for just £100 in total. To be considered for the scholarship, applicants must demonstrate that they are unable to access the programme due to financial barriers.

To be eligible for the scholarship you must:

- Self-fund the course and not be funded by your employer or university.
- Commit to attending the full programme of remaining modules in 2020 (dates available below).

- A strong case for why you are interested in this Programme and how it would benefit your professional development.

- A clear plan for what specific activities, volunteer or otherwise, you intend to undertake in international development or human rights after the Programme.
- An explanation for why the full rate would otherwise prevent you from attending.
- A commitment to attending the full course of remaining modules.

Applications must be received by 9.00hrs (BST) on 28 August 2020. Successful applicants will be notified by Wednesday 2 September 2020 and must register and pay for the Programme within 7 days of notification.
